

Geography

Our topic this term is Mountains, Oceans and the Water Cycle. Over the term the children will identify where mountain ranges are, how they are formed and their features.

We will focus on how water helps to form mountains and how the Water Cycle impacts everything.

We will take a look at the seas and oceans that make up our planet and develop our geographical understanding of the world around us, asking questions and exploring and researching.

Science

Our topic in Science this term is Sound and light.

We will look at how sound and light travel and how they are made. We will also look at how sound moves through the ear and how light moves through the eye and travels in straight lines.

The children will carry out Scientific experiments to answer questions related to these topics.

Maths

As we continue to develop our mathematical skills, we will be delving deeper into topics previously taught. We will revisit place value, recapping how to read and write numbers and rounding large numbers.

We will look at decimals and percentages and how these link with fractions taught in the Autumn term. Towards the end of the term, we will revisit shapes, this time having more of a focus on angles and how to draw and measure angles accurately.

We will finish the term off, by looking at position and direction.

Spring Term Topic Overview

Long Eared Owls

French, RE and PE

French- this term the children will be learning to talk about where they live and different types of clothes.

RE- with Mrs Buxton, the children will be learning about Judaism., looking at their place of worship and important objects. They will also be thinking about the question How do Christians remember Jesus' last supper?

PE- on a Tuesday afternoon, a coach from Shrewsbury Town in the Community will lead our PE sessions. On a Thursday, due to the current situation, we will do dance and after half term we will focus on team games.

Reading and Writing

For the first half term, we will be looking at Tom's Midnight Garden. With a focus on writing from a different perspective and comparing customs and traditions. We will explore the book in detail making predictions and summarising the text and also asking questions about what we are reading.

After February half term, we will focus on the poem The Highway Man, building up to write an informative newspaper report. The children will learn parts of the poem to re-tell their own version of the poem.

There will be lots of opportunity to link in other areas of our learning with writing such as researching and creating a biography of a famous figure linked to our Science topic of sound and light.
