

Geography

'Our Restless Earth' is our topic theme this term! We will be exploring earthquakes and volcanoes, focusing on how they occur, the impact they have on, how to survive and we will be creating our own volcanic model. Through the course of the term, we will look at earthquakes and volcanic eruptions throughout history and the effect they had.

Science

Our topic in Science this term is Space! We will travel millions of miles from Earth, exploring other planets and looking at their atmospheres and their size. We will also be looking at how the rotation of the Earth gives us day and night, the seasons and the impact of the Lunar Cycle. Throughout the topic, we will be looking at states of matter and

Maths

As we continue to develop our mathematical skills, we will be delving deeper into topics previously taught, We will revisit place value, recapping how to read and write numbers and rounding large numbers. We will look at decimals and percentages and how these link with fractions taught in the Autumn term. Towards the end of the term, we will revisit shapes, this time having more of a focus on angles and how to draw and measure angles accurately. We will finish the term off, by looking at position and direction.

Autumn Term Topic Overview Long Eared Owls

French, RE, PE and PSHE

French- this term, we will begin by recapping the basics of French, focusing on numbers and greetings. As the term progresses, we will move on to look at 'My Home' and 'The Weather'.

RE- We will be exploring the questions, What does it mean if God is holy and loving? How do people express their faith through arts?

PE- on a Tuesday afternoon, a coach from Shrewsbury Town in the Community will lead our PE sessions. On a Thursday, we will do team games, swimming, rugby or football.

PSHE- In PSHE, the two questions we will focus on this term are: What strengths, skills and interests do we have? How do we treat each other with respect?

Writing

For the first half term, we will be looking at Tom's Midnight Garden. With a focus on writing from a different perspective and comparing customs and traditions. We will explore the book in detail making predictions and summarising the text and also asking questions about what we are reading.

After February half term, we will focus on the poem The Highway Man, building up to write an informative newspaper report. The children will learn parts of the poem to re-tell their own version of the poem.

There will be lots of opportunity to link in other areas of our learning with writing such as researching and creating a biography of a famous figure linked to our Science topic of sound and light.
